It's about developing the skill to quickly assess whether the person you're talking to is relationship material, before you invest your time, emotions, or money. I learned this the hard way. I used to follow Western dating blogs religiously. Went on dates where I insisted on paying half. Ignored when men didn't call for days because "he's probably just busy." Accepted vague plans because "spontaneous is fun." These approaches backfired spectacularly in the Nigerian context.

The green flags that predict success here are different. The red flags that spell trouble are different too. You need a framework built for our culture, our economic realities, and our relationship expectations.
